Tashlich is an inspiring ritual that emphasizes the theme of renewal as we begin the New Year at the river, tossing bread crumbs into the flowing water, symbolic of our desire to cast away our wrongdoings of the past and begin the year anew. Join Rabbi Rabishaw, Educator Mary Frank and their families for this moving ceremony, and fun party.

*Directions to Pennsylvania Avenue access from Greenback Lane:
Take Sunrise Blvd. south to Fair Oaks Blvd. Turn right at Fair Oaks Blvd. and continue approximately .1 (one-tenth) of a mile to Pennsylvania Avenue (it comes up quick after the turn...the first left hand turn lane), immediately past Bob's Cycle Center. Turn left on Pennsylvania and proceed down 1/2 mile (following the River Access signs) to the parking lot at the entrance to the County Park.*
